Introduction

Moral development is about a growing awareness of, and positive response to, the demands of living as an individual with others in a community.

We believe that people who are developing morally listen to their conscience, the inner sense, informed by their upbringing, experiences and faith or religious beliefs that prompts them to do what is right out of love for others, respect for themselves and regard for the world in which they live.

The educational mission of the Church brings to life Christ's new commandment 'that you love one another as I have loved you'. (John 13:34).

This gospel value is lived out in the daily life of the school as highlighted in our Mission Statement through welcoming, respecting and understanding.
