**New Government Guidelines around School Attendance and Fixed Penalty Notices **

There is a single consistent national threshold for when a Penalty Notice must be considered in England. This is 10 sessions (usually equivalent to 5 days) of unauthorised absence within a rolling 10-school week period. These sessions do not have to be consecutive and can be made up of a combination of any type of unauthorised absence. The 10-school week period can span over different terms and school years.

First Offence

The first time a Penalty Notice is issued for a Term Time Holiday or Irregular School Attendance the Penalty Notice will be charged at: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. Reduced to £80 per parent, per child if paid within 21 days.

Second Offence (within 3 years of the First Offence)

Where a second Penalty Notice is issued to the same parent for the same pupil within 3 years of the first notice, the second Penalty Notice will be charged at: £160 per parent, per child paid within 28 days. (Unpaid Penalty Notice's after 28 days may result in a prosecution)

Third Offence and any further Offences (within 3 years of the First Offence)

The third time that an offence is committed for either a term time holiday and/or Irregular attendance, a Penalty Notice will not be issued, the case may be proceeded straight to prosecution under the Single Justice Procedure. If found guilty of the offence of 'failure to secure their child's regular attendance at a school' the Magistrates can impose a fine up to $\mathfrak{L}1,000$.
